




Do You Have School Age Children?




Students in Ballston Spa Get A Quality Education:




Which Of The Following Influenced Your Vote?




School Taxes in Ballston Spa Are Reasonable:






3rd Grade Proficiency Rates and Percentiles:




ELA 3: % Growth 2013-2015




Math 3: % Growth 2013-2015

- Class of 2017 (current Juniors): First cohort of graduates required to pass Common Core Regents Exams for graduation at the current score of 65.
- Class of 2022 (current 6th Graders): First cohort of high school graduates required to pass Common Core Regents Exams for graduation at the college and career ready score.
 - Currently 79% in ELA; 74% in Algebra




Class of 2016 ELA

Class of 2016 Math



Barriers to Education

Free and Reduced Lunch*

District Average: 30% (+4%)

• Wood Road: 43% (+6%) (29% in 09-10)

• Milton Terrace North: 38% (+4%) (28% in 09-10)

• Middle School: 32% (+6%)

• Gordon Creek: 26%

• High School: 23%

• Malta Ave.: 23% (+4%)



Barriers to Education

- Families in Transition:
 - We served 178 students from 131 Families that were homeless, at-risk of becoming homeless or in temporary housing.



Operations Benchmarks: Transportation, Operations and Maintenance and IT



Transportation:

- Fleet of 83 buses logged 900,000 miles on 125 regular routes
 - That's like driving to the Moon, back to Earth,
 back to the Moon and then halfway back to Earth
- 98% DOT Inspection passing rate
 - One of the highest in the State
- 45 Drivers earned safety awards last year



Facilities:

- Everyday, all year, we maintain the equivalent of approximately 420 average size homes that sit on a half acre lot.
- Last year we spread 431 tons of salt and applied almost 1600 gallons of floor wax.
- Over 7000 events scheduled across our facilities in 2014-2015

- Closed approximately 3000 technology work order in 2014-2015

 - Replaced all HS/MS Network Switches





Looking Ahead: Economics and Politics



Politics:

- Unanswered policy questions about standards and assessment








Economics:

- We are still owed \$1.4 Million in state aid since 2010
- We met the 2015-2016 Property Tax Rebate qualifications
- Challenge of decreased assessment of GLOBALFOUNDRIES Facilities
 - Will cost us on average \$500,000 \$1,000,000
 annually for 10 years
- Related district wide Article 7 matters
- Obamacare and related uncontrolled costs
