School Resource Officers Begin in Schools

The district recently welcomed two Deputies from the Saratoga County Sheriff's Office into our schools as part of the School Resource Officer program in Saratoga County. The officers are now full-time members of our staff and will focus on keeping students and staff safe and our buildings secure; teaching students healthy behaviors including respecting others, drug awareness, internet safety, and conflict resolution; and to be a positive part of our school community. Deputy

Jillian Lyons will work with elementary students and staff in all four elementary schools and her office is centrally located at Milton Terrace. Deputy Jon Becker will be located at the Ballston Spa High and Middle Schools to work with students in grades 6-12.

"The district clearly made an excellent choice in the selection of Deputies Lyons and Becker for these important



yet sensitive positions," said Superintendent Ken Slentz.
"After meeting with the two officers and their supervisors to discuss the specific roles and responsibilities of each officer, I am confident that they will play an important part in further ensuring that our students and staff feel safe

and secure in their learning environments," he said.

Deputy Lyons has been a member of the Saratoga County Sheriff's Office (SCSO) since 2015, most recently serving on the Community Preparedness and Youth Services team in addition to being assigned to road patrol. She is also a member of the Honor Guard Team for the SCSO. Deputy Lyons obtained her Law Enforcement Certification from the Zone 5 Law Enforcement Academy in Schenectady. She is

also a certified EMT, is a current resident of Malta and enjoys spending time with her dog, reading, and traveling.

Deputy Becker joined the ranks of the SCSO in 2016 after serving the City of Gloversville Police Department where he worked as a Patrolman since 2010. He was involved with community policing as well as working with the Gloversville Enlarged School District and was a member of the Emergency Response Team (SWAT).

One student at each elementary school is presented annually with the Maurice "Christopher" Morley Literacy Award. Members of the school's FIRST Robotics Competition Team 3044, OxBe4, offered the LEGO Robotics Academy as part of their efforts to get 4th, 5th and 6th grade students involved in STEM activities.

The LEGO Robotics Academy, which is an annual fundraiser for Team 3044, provides an opportunity for the High School students to develop their communication and leadership skills as they work with the younger students. The week culminated with the students demonstrating what they learned for their parents and friends as they earned their EV3 Robotics License. Many of the students who attended the program will now apply the knowledge they acquired this summer as they participate on FIRST LEGO League Robotics teams in the Ballston Spa schools this fall.

Facilities Improvement Bond Referendum

October 16, 2018 **Phase III**


To the Ballston Spa Community:

On Tuesday, October 16, the Board of Education is hosting a public referendum on a Facilities Improvement Project **Phase III** to address ongoing building infrastructure needs. The proposed improvements will address critical health, safety and infrastructure items in the Grove Street section of the Malta Avenue Elementary School; outdated classrooms, bathrooms and locker rooms in the Ballston Spa Middle School; the replacement of the cogeneration equipment and related control systems and upgrades to the auditorium and technology classroom access in the High School; and the rehabilitation of fields in front of and behind the Middle School, the construction of a new multipurpose field on the south end of the campus, and a new athletic storage building to support the athletic program.

The proposed improvements are based on the recommendations of the District-Wide Facilities Planning Team, which was an advisory committee assisting the district with the development of a long-range and comprehensive facilities plan. The committee started meeting in June 2009 and presented its findings to the Board of Education in January 2010.

Detailed information about the plan, including specific work at the schools, tax impact and drawings of the proposed work are contained within this newsletter. Additional information is also located on the district website at https://www.bscsd.org/ domain/942.



Proposed Renovations at the Malta Avenue Elementary School



Malta Avenue Elementary School - Phase III Improvements

Improvements to the Malta Avenue Elementary School will be completed within the Grove Street section of the building (1920s). This area was not included during Phase I upgrades to the other parts of the building. The proposal includes restoration projects in the auditorium (including new seating), gymnasium (removing the center wall to allow for a full size gymnasium), and kitchen, as well as renovations to outdated classrooms, removal of old lockers, and corridor finish upgrades (floors, ceilings, painting).

Why invest in Malta Avenue Elementary School?

Malta Avenue Elementary School is a historically significant and valuable asset to the school district. It is important to the school district and school community and provides a cornerstone link between the district, the community and our collective roots. The school is made of good building stock (built to last more than 100 years), can be updated with reasonable renovation costs which qualify for significant state building aid reimbursement (approximately 75%).



Proposed Renovations at the Ballston Spa High School




High School – Phase III Improvements

Proposed renovations include the replacement of the cogeneration heating system for both the High and Middle Schools that was original to the building when it opened in 1998. The by-product heat from power production provides hot water for both buildings, along with High School air conditioning, pool temperature control, and dehumidification control. Aging heat pumps that control the heating and cooling of classrooms and offices will also be replaced. In the auditorium we will replace the stage curtains, select lighting and controls, as well as updating portions of the rigging system. Finally, a second overhead door will be added to the Technology/Shop area to allow better access to the classrooms.

Proposed Athletic Field/Facility Improvements

To accomodate our growing athletic program and community use, athletic fields in front of the schools on Ballston Avenue and the practice field on the west side of the Middle School will be refurbished. An additional multipurpose field will be added to the south side of the complex with access from the High School Staff parking area. A new athletic storage building, complete with a uniform drying area, will be constructed near the current football stadium.



Middle School - Phase III Improvements

The 1950s classrooms at the Ballston Spa Middle School will be updated, including the renovation of old science labs. The Technology and Art classrooms will be reconfigured to serve current curriculum needs and bathrooms original to the building will be renovated in several wings. Improvements will be made in the gymnasium including window replacement, lighting and ventilation upgrades, and the rehabilitation of the locker rooms. The proposal also includes the replacement of student lockers in the hallways and related renovations to common areas.































The Ballston Spa Central School District will hold a referendum for registered voters of the district to consider the following proposition on a ballot at the polls on October 16, 2018. Polls are open from 7:00 am – 9:00 pm in the Ballston Spa High School (residents of the towns of Ballston, Milton and Charlton) and the Malta Town Hall (Malta residents). Voters will cast a vote on the following proposition:

Proposition on the Ballot: Facilities Improvement Bond

That the Board of Education of the Ballston Spa Central School District, in the County of Saratoga, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct improvements and alterations to various District buildings and sites (the "Project"), and to expend therefor an amount not to exceed \$23,980,000; (b) that the amount of \$6,325,000 from the District's Capital Reserve Fund, approved by the voters of the District on May 18, 2010, is hereby authorized to be expended to pay a portion of the cost of the Project, and such expenditure is hereby approved; and (c) that a tax in the amount of not to exceed \$17,655,000 is hereby voted to pay the balance of cost of the Project, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education; and that in anticipation of said tax, the Board of Education is authorized to issue bonds of the District in the principal amount of not to exceed \$17,655,000, and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.



New Superintendent Assumes Role as District Leader

The district welcomed Kenneth Slentz as the new Superintendent of Schools in August. Mr. Slentz most recently served as the Superintendent of the Skaneateles Central School District.



"Mr. Slentz impressed the

Board with his years of experience in many different educational capacities, including the time he spent at the State Education Department," indicated Kevin Schaefer, then President of the Board of Education. "The Board was in complete agreement that Mr. Slentz would lead the district forward so that our students will continue to be exposed to many great opportunities. We welcome him and his wife to our community."

Prior to joining the Skaneateles district, Mr. Slentz served for five years as the Deputy Commissioner for PK-12 Education for the New York State Education Department. Over his 24 years in public education, Mr. Slentz has also served as a teaching assistant, as a middle school social studies teacher, Curriculum Coordinator, and Principal as well as a Superintendent at both Long Lake and West Canada Valley Central School Districts.

Mr. Slentz holds a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from SUNY Geneseo, a Master's Degree in Education from SUNY Oswego and received Administrative Certification from SUNY Plattsburgh. Mr. Slentz was chosen through a confidential search conducted by the Board of Education and included a small group of stakeholders who represented central and building level administration, teaching and support staff, operations staff and community members. Mr. Slentz and his wife Katie have one daughter, Keller, and have relocated to the area.

New Wood Road Elementary School Principal

Mr. Anders Rasmussen was appointed as the new Wood Road Elementary School (WRES) Principal in July. Mr. Rasmussen, who has been with the district since 2012, was most recently serving as Assistant Principal at the High School. Prior to his service



in Ballston Spa, he held administrative positions at the Greenville School District and he was an English teacher and coach at Ichabod Crane Middle School. Mr. Rasmussen holds a Bachelor's Degree in English from University at Albany, and both a Master's Degree in Education and Administrative Certification from The College of St. Rose. He holds New York State Certification as a School Building Leader. Mr. Rasmussen currently resides in Clifton Park with his wife, Cheryl, and their four children.

New High School Principal

Mr. Gianleo Duca was selected as the new High School Principal in June 2018. Mr. Duca served as Interim Principal in June after then Principal Jensen moved to serve as Director of Special Education. He served as Assistant Principal since 2015 with his prior educational



experience including Social Studies teaching positions at South Colonie High School and Medford High School. Mr. Duca holds a Bachelor's Degree in History/ Education from Western New England University, a Master's Degree in Education from Salem State University and received Administrative Certification from Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts. He holds New York State Certification as a School District and a School Building Leader. Mr. Duca currently resides in Waterford, NY.

Don Brandt joined the team after serving most recently as Assistant Principal at Queensbury Middle School. His prior leadership roles include Principal in The Albany Academies Middle and Elementary Schools for two years and serving in the classroom for nine years in The Albany Academies and Schalmont Central School District. 

School District News & Facilities Bond Referendum Information – Fall 2018

The Board of Education has scheduled a Facilities Improvement Bond Referendum on October 16, 2018 to seek the public's approval to fund Phase III of the district's facilities master plan. The proposed improvements include renovations that address critical building infrastructure needs, health and safety issues and aging facilities.
